Recently we have had a reminder that the weather drives all our decisions and activities on the farm. We had fairly good weather for harvest, with a week of wet weather in August clearing up before the wheat quality was ruined. We had quite low rainfall last winter and spring, and a dry summer, however the wheat has yielded really well with good bread making qualities, we think it put down deep roots in the spring allowing it to cope well in the dry conditions of May, June and July, the plentiful sunshine (energy) giving the quality.

The maize has yielded better than last year and importantly we managed to harvest it just before the wet spell in late September and October began. Since then we have had 8 inches of rain in 3 weeks. There are still many acres of maize to harvest around the UK, a crucial part of winter cow rations still to be

harvested. This is a real concern if roadwork is involved, as it becomes very muddy. While it has been raining we should have been planting our winter wheat seed, hopefully the end of October will be kind and we will get it planted.

Our milking cows are now housed for winter. We have had many calves born in the last two months, which is keeping us busy, most of the Holstein calves have been born. The female calves will join the herd in two years time, the males being reared for beef. The calves born for the next six months have been sired by a beef bull. Some of these we will rear, others we will sell to other farmers to rear.

We usually use a British Blue bull but as an experiment we used a Wagyu bull a few times, we have just had the first two born which will be interesting to see how these fare as they grow. Wagyu beef is from one of four Japanese breeds, it can be some of the most expensive meats in the world. It has fine texture, the fat is distributed more evenly through the muscle so it looks pink and is really tender. Traditionally Wagyu beef cattle in Japan are fed beer and regularly massaged to reduce stress, so there could be new job opportunities for masseuses in the future!

Arla's (our milk buying cooperative) milk price has been stable for the last six months at a sustainable level. Other companies have not been so reliable with some 20% less than ours. Tomlinsons, a dairy that processes milk for Sainsburys has just called the receivers in so its supplying farmers will most likely lose six weeks of milk revenue, a crippling blow for some.

On the Farm continued

This reminds us of when Dairy Farmers of Britain folded about 15 years ago. We were caught up with them, a supportive bank becomes very important then.

A hot topic in farming at the moment is climate change. According to the NFU, agriculture is responsible for 10% of green house emissions. Coming in well behind transport at 27% and energy supply at 24%. The NFU has a target for agriculture to be net zero by 2040. Arla which is a Northern European company has a target of 2050, with the aim of reducing gas emissions by 30% per kilo of milk in the next decade.

There are many figures being banded around about livestock farming's carbon footprint, some of them do not seem to be creditable, certainly not in relation to British farming systems.

As an Arla supplier we have been calculating our carbon footprint for a number of years, not always convinced that the consumer has been that interested when making their purchases. Maybe this will change, or maybe just be confident in companies like Arla that are doing all they can to produce environmentally friendly products. The UK is ahead of the game, it is probably never a better time to encourage consumers to buy British reared and produced products.

With all the negative press farming receives we have been tagged in some positive tweets recently which really brightens your day up. Also last week whilst our Landrover was parked in Princes Risborough it had two notes attached to it, the first handwritten one read: THANK YOU FOR BEING A FARMER, the other note was of monetary value. This was obviously unusual but also fantastically appreciated by our family and staff, the donation is heading to the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution for whom we try to raise money each year. So to who ever put it there a big thank you.

The Month of November

The change from British Summer Time to Greenwich Mean Time takes place over the final weekend of October and so in the northern hemisphere, the month of November heralds the arrival of Winter. With clocks having gone back an hour, the fall of darkness occurs noticeably earlier and earlier as the month unfolds. For some people, this can be a very depressing time of the year but for others November can be the best month of the Winter season.

The stream of rituals and festivals which occur in November – All Saints Day, All Souls Day, Bonfire Night, Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day, the Feast of Christ the King and Saint Andrew's Daymake the month of November truly a season for remembering.

All Saints Day, or All Hallows, falls on 1st November. Its origin can be traced back to the 4th Century as a Feast to commemorate Christian Martyrs. By the beginning of the 9th Century it had evolved into an occasion to remember a great myriad of saints, the vast majority of whom are unknown to us by name.

All Souls Day falls on 2nd November and was first observed by Odilo, Abbot of Cluny, in AD 998. All Souls Day gained a renewed emphasis in the life of the Church of England following the huge and tragic loss of life in the First World War; and is a day when our departed loved ones are remembered by name in the course of the Church service. Latterly, the keeping of All Saints Sunday, the Sunday adjacent to All Saints and All Souls, has gained popularity and this year falls on 3rd November when our 10am Sunday Service will be both an opportunity for intercessory prayer with laying on of hands as well as

the All Souls solemn commemoration by name of departed loved ones.

In addition to this commemoration, on Sunday 17th November at 3.30pm, we have at St. John's Church our annual bereavement service to which we invite families who have experienced the deep pain of bereavement in recent times. Departed loved ones are remembered by name, and candles are lit for each of those whose names are read out.

Bonfire Night first arose as a remembering of the foiled gunpowder plot of 1605 in which Guy Fawkes was captured in the course of an attempt to blow up Parliament. Within 20 years of these events 5th November was designated Bonfire Night in Britain; and the celebration has never waned even though the anti-Catholic sentiments which lay behind the original Act of Parliament seem wholly and entirely inappropriate to the modern mind.

Remembrance Sunday this year falls on 10th November. Our 10am Service is always very well attended on this important occasion which incorporates the Two Minute Silence at 11am. This solemn observance marks the end of fighting in the First World War in 1918. The service also includes the reading of names of those of our community who gave their lives whilst on active service in the two World Wars; as well as the act of Laying of Wreaths and Poppy Crosses, which we anticipate will this year include wreaths laid on behalf of the Royal Air Force, The Royal Navy, the Parish Council, and St. John's School. The keeping of Armistice Day on 11th November by way of a national observance of the Two Minutes

Silence at 11am has hugely grown in significance in recent times due to a large degree to the active efforts of the Royal British Legion. Armistice Day most often falls on a weekday which means the commemoration is able to be widely observed in schools and in places of work.

The Feast of Christ the King this year falls on Sunday 24th November and brings the liturgical year of the Church to a conclusion. The festival celebrates the Christian doctrine of the role of Jesus Christ as ruler of the cosmos.

Saint Andrew's Day falls on 30th November and he is, of course, the Patron Saint of Scotland. He was a fisherman along with his brother Peter; and together they were called by Jesus to be among the 12 Apostles. Saint Andrew is believed to have spread the Gospel through Asia Minor and Greece. It is believed that he was martyred at Patras in Greece by crucifixion upside down on a saltire, a diagonal cross. His association with Scotland is attributed to the bringing of some of his relics to a chapel which later became the site of the mediaeval Cathedral of Saint Andrew in Fife; reduced to ruins in 1559 at the time of the Reformation but remaining a significant place of pilgrimage to this day.

Advent Sunday this year falls on 1st December and thus begins a new liturgical year in the church calendar. On Advent Sunday this year we have at 10am our annual Toy Service in support of the distribution by the Salvation Army of Christmas gifts for needy children; as well as our traditional Advent Carol Service at 3.30pm.

County Council News



Autumn is now upon us! As I write this, it is a rather grey and wet day outside with the leaves falling off the trees.

Roads and parking

I am delighted to say that a number of roads in Lacey Green were part of the micro-surfacing programme in late September, such as Westlands Road, Eastlands Road, Woodfield, Greenlands, Meadow Rise, Roundlands, and Goodacres Lane. This was long overdue having been deferred from last year, and is a great improvement.

I met in May with officers at Transport for Buckinghamshire to look at the feasibility of making Main Road Lacey Green just past St Johns School safer. Currently as you approach Lacey Green from the Walters Ash direction, the speed limit is the National Speed limit which reduces down to 30 mph just before a blind bend. With residents and parents of school children parking on the bend, it forces vehicles travelling from the Princes Risborough direction to have to travel on the wrong side of the road on this blind bend.

In conjunction with Lacey Green Parish Council and with match funding from the North West Chilterns Local Area Forum which is a Bucks County Council initiative, we are about to hold a public consultation on parking with a view to implement some parking restrictions. Part of the zigzag lines will be extended to cover the pedestrian entrance to the school as well as having a demarcation box for the bus stop. I have been approached by a parent who is very keen to engage further with the school to further develop a school travel plan in conjunction with the consultation.

Recycling Centre

As you may be aware, the Bledlow Ridge Household Recycling Centre was closed by Bucks County Council on 31st March as savings had to be made across the portfolio.

There was strong opposition to the closure including myself. A petition of 4,500 signatures was handed in but to no avail.

As a result, my County Councillor colleague Bill Bendyshe- Brown and myself have formed the Bledlow Ridge HRC Community Interest Company with a view to gaining planning permission and to reopen the facility for the benefit of local residents.

We have the support of 12 Parish and Town Councils including Lacey Green, with a representative from each sitting on a committee. With crowdfunding we have now raised nearly £9,000. We went out to tender for a planning consultant and have now

appointed one. We are currently in negotiations with Bucks County Council for a long term lease for the site. Once we have got planning permission, the Community Interest Company will go out to tender for a commercial organisation to operate the site under the direction of the CIC.

We are looking for volunteers who would like to assist with this venture: if you have a legal background, surveying background or an IT background for example or anything else, please don't hesitate to get in touch with me.

Unitary Council

The Shadow Executive is now meeting on a very regular basis to ensure that there will be a seamless transition to the new Buckinghamshire Council on 1st April 2020 when Wycombe District Council and Bucks County Council are abolished.

Various tiers of officers are being recruited for the new Council. Rachael Shimmin, the current CEO of Bucks County Council and Interim CEO of the Shadow Authority has already been appointed as permanent CEO.

Interviews for the next tier are being held currently with announcements being made shortly. Further tiers of officers are scheduled to be recruited from December onwards.


