Speen Helping Hospices

In the last edition of Hallmark I invited you to visit us at our annual Christmas Market, normally in the Chapel Hall but moved, due to distancing constraints, to a very airy marquee on Speen Playing Field. However within days of Hallmark going to print we had to change our plans again!

Lockdown 2 meant no Christmas Market and we had to have a rethink! Within ten days we had an online SHH Christmas Market Shop up and running and it has been a roaring success, as we sold over £2,000 worth of stock. Adding to this, a group of women from North Dean and Speen - "The Sassy Santas" - did a sponsored fun run around the village and raised £1,500. With the Christmas hamper raffle and door to door carol singing we raised £6,448 before Lockdown

In a challenging year SHH has raised £17,604. With the small cushion we had at the start of the year we can now donate £4,500 to each of the four hospices, Helen House for Children, Rennie Grove Hospice, Florence Nightingale and South Bucks Hospice Care.

Nevertheless, we can assure you all that the Hall is well maintained and will be ready to welcome back visitors just as soon as conditions permit.

The Village Hall operates as a charity run solely by volunteers, we are very lucky that we sometimes benefit from small grants too. We are financially secure in the short to medium term. We continue to hold a fund that is ring fenced to pay for much needed resurfacing of the car park, and once we are operational again we will be looking to raise the extra money required to complete that task. It's a long road, but we will get there!

Meantime, in addition to managing the running of the Village Hall, the operating committee is also ultimately responsible for publishing Hallmark, your local magazine. This magazine has the benefit of an excellent team, spearheaded by our editor, Mike Piercy. He, the advertising and delivery volunteers work tirelessly to bring us a fabulous magazine and I'm sure you'll agree that the outcome is excellent and goes a long way to bringing our community together.

We hope that we can continue to publish four editions a year, but as with everything that comes at a cost.



Jill was born on 26th November and grew up in Pinner, Middlesex. She met Chris, her husband to be, at a local Square Dancing Club while he was still at school and Jill was studying for Shorthand and Typing exams.

Jill started her working life as a secretary at Currys head office in Ealing, before moving to The Royal Air Force's Escaping Society in London. Unfortunately, Jill's father died when she was 21 which necessitated Jill having to leave London and move to Felpham near Bognor Regis so she could look after her mother who was unwell. Chris was a regular visitor, travelling down from college each weekend, whatever the weather, on his moped.

Jill and Chris were married on 16th July 1960 and moved to Haslemere in Surrey where Chris took up his first teaching post and Jill worked for ICI. Jill and Chris subsequently moved to Witley in Surrey, where they lived for 38 years, becoming involved in many of the local organisations and where Jill's love of crafts developed. She became skilled at dressmaking, patchwork, spinning, weaving and lacemaking - she was never happier than when using a needle and thread. Jill often demonstrated these crafts at local fetes and events and was always keen to pass on her knowledge.

In 2000, when Chris retired, Jill moved with Chris to Lacey Green to be near to family. They joined various groups, took on Committee responsibilities and made many friends. They both loved the local countryside and enjoyed many relaxing walks with their dog Dolly. Jill's main interest was her family; she enjoyed the company of her 5 grandchildren and seeing them all grow up.

Jill and Chris were happily married for 60 years and celebrated their Diamond Anniversary in July 2020. Sadly, after 4 ½ years of living with cancer, Jill became unwell and died peacefully at home, with family present, on 11th December.



As a family we have had many sympathy cards from local friends, which have been a great support and for which we thank you. Due to the latest Covid restrictions we had a very small, meaningful cremation service for Jill, led by Rev. Tony Bundock, on 7th January 2021.

Unfortunately, the impact of the pandemic on the fitness of children has been laid bare in a major report by Sport England which shows that more than half are failing to meet recommended daily activity levels.

This is reflected in all grassroot sports. For our part, since the lockdown in November and the recent one at the end of December, junior coaching has been limited to a couple of weeks prior to the end of term at Christmas.

Once the country is back to some sort of normality, we offer 11 junior sessions each week, tailored for all age groups from 3-17. The mental, physical and social aspects gained from taking part are immense and really help with your child's well-being. The skills learnt last a lifetime, with the sport still having many playing in their 80s.

We took advantage of the closure in November to replace the net on court 1 and have our expanded car park properly made, with hardcore and road planings. The committee is very grateful to Stuart Putnam for the excellent work he carried out which went well beyond our

original specification. We can now fit in 20 cars - perfect for those busy Thursday evenings and Saturday mornings.

This year, we would like to floodlight court 3 and it was great to have notification on 12th January that we had been granted planning permission. We have applied for a couple of grants, so fingers crossed some of these will be successful.

The improvements to the facilities and the growth in membership, have not gone unnoticed with the Lawn Tennis Association (LTA). We were pleased to be nationally profiled in their November magazine and the club was highlighted at the recent Bucks LTA AGM to encourage other clubs to invest and grow.

Our coach Dan had an excellent response to our new walking tennis programme which normally runs on Wednesday mornings. We are the first club in Bucks to offer it. It is a slower form of tennis using softer balls where 2 bounces are permitted. The feedback has been excellent with one lady telling Dan: "I've enjoyed it so much; I'm going straight out to buy myself a new

If you are thinking about taking up tennis this year, we will again be offering some free beginners' coaching for new members on Saturday mornings in the spring.

If you feel a bit shy or daunted by social tennis or club nights, we're friendly and inclusive and will do our best to make you feel quickly at home. One option is to have a "tennis buddy" - someone to ease you through the first couple of weeks. We can easily put you in touch with an existing member who'd be happy to help out.

If any of the above interests you, please have a look at our website which has all the information on membership, coaching, booking courts etc. We also regularly post on Facebook and Instagram so you can see all our latest pictures and news.

I'm an optimist and even though it feels bleak with lockdown and the dark evenings, before long, Covid-19 will be under control, the weather will be better, moods will improve, and tennis will be on the agenda again.






Lockdown litter pick in Loosley Row!

County Council News



Firstly I wish you all a belated Happy New Year.

The Council officers and members continue to work hard with our partners to ensure that all services that are provided for residents are maintained as much as possible and that all are kept safe.

Weekly briefings inform members of the numbers of Covid -19 case reports in Buckinghamshire, broken down into the former District Council areas and compared to the rest of England and the South East. Afterwards, the presentation slides are sent to members and Parish Councils.

Vaccination choices

The vaccination programme is ramping up across the country and concerns have been raised locally as to what is happening in our area. The rollout of this is the responsibility of the NHS and not Buckinghamshire Council. Notification to residents will be from the NHS.

There are a number of different ways you could be vaccinated:

- 1 At a local vaccination site run by Buckinghamshire GPs
- 2 At a pharmacy site, organised nationally by the NHS

3 At a national vaccination site, organised nationally by the NHS

4 At a hospital if you're a health or social care worker

5 At a care home where GPs are responsible for delivering the vaccine directly to residents and staff.

GP-led vaccine sites

GP surgeries across the county have come together to form nine GP-led vaccination sites in Bucks. This means that when it's your turn, you'll be invited for vaccination by your own surgery, but will go to one of these nine sites chosen by your GP to receive it.

The aim is that all residents over the age of 80 will have been offered a vaccination appointment through their GP by the end of January.

There are currently four GP-led sites open in our area - in Aylesbury, Princes Risborough Chesham and High Wycombe

Pharmacy-led vaccine sites

By the time you read this there will be 5 active local pharmacy vaccination sites. Patients will have a choice of attending either a GP-led site or a pharmacy-led site if that is more convenient.

There are also national vaccination sites in neighbouring counties. Letters of invitation will be sent from the NHS to people in the current priority cohort. The letter explains that you can book a slot at one of the national sites over the phone or online via the national booking service.

Any residents who have had this letter can choose to book through the national system if

they wish to. If you choose not to have an appointment at a national site, it will not affect your ability to get an appointment at a local site through your GP.

Community Board

The North West Community Board as reported in the last edition is moving forward well with sub groups that have been created to look at issues such as Adults and Wellbeing, Economic and Regeneration of local village assets such as pubs and village stores, and Transport from speeding to parking issues.

On the back of these initiatives, funding has been made available. One such scheme is to improve the safety of pedestrians and motorists close to St Johns School in Lacey Green which is moving forward. Match funding has been agreed through the North West Chilterns Community Board and it is now with Transport for Buckinghamshire to go through the Statutory consultation and the legalities to change the Traffic Regulatory Order (TRO).

Happy New Year. Let's hope 2021 is a better year than 2020. It is however starting in a worrisome way. Although there is a pin prick of light at the end of the Covid-19 tunnel, there is still a long way to go. As far as industries go agriculture has been economically less affected than most. Our product is generally food and, unsurprisingly, demand has stayed at similar levels!

The lockdowns have however, created changes in buying patterns. For instance, in the first lockdown, demand for high end beef cuts and steaks dropped and mince went up. This led to the high value cuts being devalued by mincing them. We cannot complain and our heart goes out to anyone involved in the hospitality and entertainment industries who must have had an exceedingly difficult year.

We have been lucky to date that we have had no staff off with Covid-19. Some have had to self-isolate as their relatives have had the virus. Obviously it is potentially a big problem with the cows' welfare to protect.

Brexit has happened. The cooperative we belong to and sell our milk to, Arla, is a European company and has been desperately hoping for a reasonable deal so our products can move without tariffs over our borders. There is undoubtedly more complexity and administration involved now.

Arla ships approximately 150 containers of product per week to the UK. Typically coming across the North Sea from Denmark to Immingham would be Lurpak products, butter, Starbuck products and mozzarella amongst others.

Shipments the other way are more limited but would include cheddar and whey for Arla food ingredients, and tanker loads of cream.

On January 1st we had a price drop of just over 3% mainly due to Brexit costs. Since then the Global Dairy trade auction prices have been moving up, so hopefully we will recover that before long. This is important as the spot market for most of our cattle feeds (our biggest input) are soaring up over 30% in some cases.

We have had quite a few calves now by the bull 'La La' a British Blue. He throws calves with very distinct markings, mainly white with a black muzzle. The photo above shows a batch of them that are just about to be weaned. They are very popular amongst the calf rearers here! They will be in the fields around Lacey Green next summer so keep an eye out for them!

Once again, we have some supplementary farmland bird feeders out this winter. We did a quick assessment recently to see what was using them; we saw mainly chaffinch, a few vellow hammers and more unusually a marsh tit. We have also recently seen an egret (probably a great one but possibly a cattle one) and a jack snipe which were both good species to see. In February we will be doing a fuller winter bird survey and the GWCT farmland bird count so we will let you know what we find.

Heavenly Bodies

What better way to forget our current planetary problem for a while and gaze up into the night sky? It may be chilly but it's dark nice and early!

Firstly though, you may have seen the so-called 'Great Conjunction' just before Christmas. This was when Saturn and Jupiter appeared the closest together in our skies for almost four centuries. When the clouds parted briefly, I was able to take the image on this page showing the two planets and Jupiter's four main moons. This was using a telescope and specialised camera - to the naked eye, it was difficult to separate the planets as they were so close to each other.

The two giant planets have left our night-time, and our February evening skies are now dominated by the spectacular Orion constellation with a guest appearance by Mars. The Red Planet, which looks like an orange star, is nudging its way towards the 'Seven Sisters' star cluster (The Pleiades). You can see it in the south-west as soon as it gets dark along with a bright star up and left called Aldebaran which is the main star of the constellation of Taurus.

On the 18th February, Mars will be above the crescent Moon.

and the following night the Moon glides in between Mars and Aldebaran - see sky chart below. With the Pleiades in view as well, it should be a magical sight.

No less than three space missions are due to reach Mars this month - from the USA. China and the United Arab Emirates. They include two rovers and a mini helicopter!

By the beginning of March, Mars is getting near the Pleiades and is at its closest on the 3rd. It then moves guickly up and left each night, bisecting Aldebaran and

the Pleiades. Best to view it between 7pm and 8pm before it drifts too low down in the sky. On the 18th, the Moon joins the party helping to form a rectangle with Mars, Aldebaran and the Pleiades. The Moon moves to be next to Mars the following night.

Day and night become equal on the 20th at the Spring Equinox, and the clocks go forward an hour on the 28th as British Summer Time begins. Also on the 28th, the first of four 'supermoons' occurs. This is when the Moon is bigger and brighter than usual. It will be at its biggest and brightest for the vear on 26th May.

Look out for Venus in the second half of April, low in the west after sunset. It gets steadily brighter during the following months as the 'Evening Star'. For early risers, Jupiter and Saturn are in our pre-dawn skies from mid-April in the south-east.

Have fun watching our Universe over the next few months. Heavenly Bodies returns in August when, hopefully, our situation on planet Earth will have vastly improved.

Children's workshop School Hall between 11.00 and 12.15: making miniature gardens and Potato Superhero. See information overleaf. Items will be taken to the Village Hall and judged in the afternoon.

Class no. Description

Children's Section - three age groups will be eligible for all classes: 11-16, 7-10 and 6 and under

- A Lego model own design using only Lego units
- A vegetable Medal construct a medal to award to someone who did outstanding work in the Covid Lockdowns – any kind of veg may be used in any combination!
- Banana Bread. Recipe overleaf. Cover with cling film.
- The Tallest Daffodil must be home-grown and cut at the base of the stem
- Miniature Garden made in the morning workshop or at home. They should be in a half size seed tray (approximately 22x16 cm.)
- Vegetable Superhero a figure/ head based on a potato (no kits to be used) made at home or in workshop
- Egg Head an eggshell head with growing cress (or similar sprouting seeds) for hair. (Cress takes about 7-10 days to grow)
- A Jam Jar of Flowers and Foliage to be judged for its decorative effect.
- A Decorated Poem No larger than A4. Handwritten for those 7 and over; those under 6 may use a printed poem and add decoration. Look at Illuminated manuscripts for inspiration.

Adult Classes – over 16

- 3 sticks of Rhubarb The sticks should be pulled not cut from the plant and leaves cut off about 7cms from the end of the stalk. Judges look for uniformity, straightness and good colour.
- 1 specimen bloom daffodil or narcissus (display cut in a vase use crushed newspaper to stabilise)
- 3 Daffodils or narcissi any one species as above

- 24 An Edible Necklace using any kind of edible materials.
- A Flowering Pot Plant no larger than 1M in any direction. Plants must have been in the exhibitor's care for at least 3 months.

All entries are 20p per class for members (children 16 and under are free). Adult non-members are welcome to enter at 30p per class.

All exhibits must be grown/made by the exhibitor except for floral art exhibitions and additions to miniature gardens

Recipes – Where sizes are specified tins may be within 1inch or 2.5cm of given dimension larger or smaller

Banana Bread. 100g butter; 175g sugar - half muscovado and half caster; 2 eggs; 2 very ripe bananas mashed; 225g self-raising flour; 1 tsp baking powder; 2 tbsp milk; 30g chopped walnuts; 30g sultanas. Method: Heat oven to 180°C/Gas mark 4. Grease and line a 2lb loaf tin with non-stick baking parchment. Put all ingredients into a bowl and mix well. This is best done with an electric mixer, but if this is not available use a wooden spoon and lots of energy! Place mixture in loaf tin and bake for about 50 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. Leave to cool in the tin for ten minutes and then turn onto a wire rack and remove the paper to cool.

Cheese and Onion Pasties. Filling: 250g peeled and cubed potato (about 2cm cubes); 50g butter; 2 medium onions finely sliced; 150g mature cheddar cheese coarsely grated; 1tsp English mustard; flaked sea salt and ground black pepper. To make filling cook potatoes and drain - cool. Fry onions gently in the butter until soft and golden, but not brown - turn into a large bowl to cool. Add cool potato cubes, cheese, mustard, salt and pepper. Mix well. Pastry: 450g plain flour; 2tsp baking powder; 1/2 tsp fine sea salt; 125g cold butter; 2 large egg yolks; 50g parmesan cheese finely grated; about 150ml cold water, beaten egg to glaze. Method: put flour salt and baking powder in bowl and rub in the butter until it resembles fine bread crumbs. Add the cheese and mix well. Add water gradually until the mixture comes together into a ball. Leave to rest for half an hour in the fridge. Assemble the pasties: Divide the pastry into 6 equal pieces and roll out each to a circle about 15cm in diameter. A dish or plate may provide a good template to cut round to ensure they are even in size. Your pastry should be about 5mm thick. Place one sixth of the filling on each round shaping it into an oval across the centre of the circle. Brush the edges with beaten egg and bring up two sides over the oval filling. Press the edges firmly together and using a knife blade gently tap across the seam to seal. Crimp the edges neatly using a finger and thumb. Your seam should run across the top of the pasty. Place on a baking tray lined with non-stick parchment, brush with beaten egg and bake in a hot oven 200°C/Gas 6 for about 25 minutes until the pastry is golden brown. Makes 6 - show 3.

Cheesecake. 650g Ricotta or full fat soft cheese;228g crushed digestive biscuits; 85g butter;225g caster sugar; 2.5ml vanilla essence; 3 medium eggs beaten; 2tbsp thick double cream; 1tbsp sifted comflour; pinch of salt. Method: Heat oven to 180°C/ gas 4. Melt butter and mix with biscuits retaining 1 tbsp dry to sprinkle over the top. Place mixed biscuit crumbs in the base of a 9inch round loose bottom baking tin and press down well. Beat cheese, sugar, salt, vanilla essence together and then beat in eggs gradually. Add cream and cornflour and mix well. Pour mixture over crumb base and sprinkle remaining dry crumbs over the top of the cheesecake. Bake for 35 mins. Switch off oven and leave cheesecake for another 35 mins. Remove from tin when cold. Cover with cling film.






