POLICE

Welcome to our Local Police Update for your community area. My name is Oliver Brixey and I am the Neighbourhood Policing Sergeant who covers the Princes Risborough area, along with the Marlow Neighbourhood Policing Team and Chepping Wye Valley Neighbourhood Policing Team.

The Princes Risborough
Neighbourhood Policing Team
moved into their new Police
Office, which is located at the
Fire Station in Princes
Risborough in October 2022. It
is fantastic that we have been
able to keep the Local
Neighbourhood Policing Team
within the town and this helps
with providing High Visibility
Policing. This Police Office is
not open to the public and only
an operational base for staff.

However, you can report a crime or incident of Anti-Social Behaviour by calling 101, using the yellow phone at the front of the station or by visiting the Thames Valley Police Website.

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team is committed to supporting the community with Neighbourhood Priorities. The current priorities for the team include: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB), Speeding and Anti-Social Driving, Burglary and Rural Crime.

The most frequently reported offence category in Princes Risborough and surrounding villages during October – December of 2022 was ASB, with 60 occurrences recorded.

The team has been conducting ASB patrols across the summer months to tackle youth related ASB across the green spaces and parks across the area.

We have seen a decrease in reported ASB from the peak in the summer until December where we only received 11 reports of ASB.

We have unfortunately seen an increase in burglary and theft offences across December). We often see an increase in burglary and theft in the winter months when the days are shorter.

This is a good time to review your home security, consider installing alarms, CCTV, Ring Doorbells or additional security lighting. In addition keeping sheds and garages locked, and windows and doors closed helps to keep your property safe. Time switches are great at putting lights on when you are out, to make it appear someone is home.

There have been increased burglary patrols across the area to disrupt criminality and the Neighbourhood Policing Team has been following up with reassurance patrols and cocooning. This has been supported by our Winter Burglary Campaign on our social media platforms. Hopefully you will have seen our elf on the shelf posts.

This is a reminder if you are not already following TVP South Buckinghamshire on Facebook or TVP_SouthBucks on Twitter then please give us a follow as we provide information updates and gives you an idea what your local officers have been up to on a regular basis.

Rural Crime offences remain very similar to last year . We have seen an increase in Hare Coursing and Hunting Offences and the connected criminality such as Criminal Damage.



The Team will be providing signage to repeat locations in the coming months reminding offenders that Hare Coursing is a crime.

The Neighbourhood Policing Team attended the Christmas Light Switch On in Princes Risborough which was well attended by the community. It was great to see the lights. Here are some of photographs of our team.



A Happy and Healthy New Year to all. The Christmas season went very well at the Princes Centre. Our Jinglers Choir had an amazing turn out when they performed at St Mary's. At the centre there were lots of Christmas related activities, making and decorating Christmas cakes, making little



cone Christmas trees, calendars and other novelties, and enjoying lots of entertainment from Elvis, Dorothy B and her local choir singing classic carols and the Black Dog Band. Singing and quizzes, board games and indoor bowling also took place. We are very grateful to Dunelm who donated a large quantity of Christmas gifts for our clients in addition to the ones provided by the Centre.



We ended last year on a promising note with the arrival of contractors from IDDEA to erect the long-awaited solar panels. Together with the recently installed loft insulation above the main hall we are now expecting to reduce our energy consumption expenses over the year. We are very grateful for two large grants from Ngage Solutions through Bucks Business First and **Buckinghamshire Council North** West Chilterns Community Board who contributed towards the cost. The trustees are planning for further projects to bring us nearer to carbon neutral in the future.

We were very pleased that our grant applications to the Kop Hill Climb and to the Wyke Fund were successful. The Kop Hill Climb grant will be used to renew the pathway to the lower hall and around the back of the building and to erect fencing in that area to afford some privacy for clients. The Wyke Fund is specifically for hiring the use of a hydrotherapy pool to provide sessions to enable some of the clients, who would benefit from its use, to have the opportunity to swim or exercise in the pool. This is dependent on being able to book sessions which are available during the times that clients attend the centre.

A number of volunteers gave up some of their time before Christmas to help with a collection at Tesco. Considering that it was planned for a day which turned out to be extremely cold, they were very brave to turn up to help but Tesco's staff very kindly allowed us to be situated inside the store which was very much appreciated. A big thank you to all of them and to Tesco.

On the Farm





The daylight is getting longer which always helps after a cold or wet winter. It certainly has been wet over the last few months really making up for the drought we experienced in the summer. We still have some cattle out, which generally are not damaging the soil structure or grass leys despite the rain, the soil is far from capacity after the drought. The cattle that are out are beef rather than dairy cattle, they are Angus x Holstein (see photos) and British Blue x Holstein that are about a year old. These breeds can take adverse weather guite well and probably prefer to be outside.

The very cold weather we had in mid-December allowed us to clean the barns out, and to take the dung out to field heaps without damaging the fields as they were frozen solid. That is the best thing about the cold, the bad part is water pipes freeze and parts of the parlour freeze, so at 4 am when milking starts, any frozen parts must be identified and thawed out. The parlour holds 28 cows at a time, so the parlour does warm up quite quickly when the cows come in, exuding their heat.

The Christmas period can be quite tricky trying to allow staff have time off and keep the show on the road, we always hope for benign weather and not to have any breakdowns. Nearly everyone worked over Christmas, thanks to the team it

went well without any major issues.

Before long the main herd will be out grazing, and our attention is turning to improving grass leys. They were damaged by the drought last summer, leaving gaps between the grass which the weed 'chickweed' has now occupied, and is now smothering more grass out. So we need to remove the chickweed and plant new grass seeds. Last summers drought is also showing in our silage clamps which are not nearly as full as this time last year, so we will be hoping for an early turnout, to take the pressure off the reserves.

The roller coaster of prices is still going flat out. The milk price has been going up for many months, but it definitely looks like it's



gone over the peak and if you listen to industry commentators we are in for a scary ride. It is said the cure for high milk prices is ...'high milk prices', as production usually goes up, then consumer demand drops with high product prices, causing a surplus. Bulk cream has dropped at an alarming rate and values are now 50% what they were only two months ago.

Fuel costs have come back significantly, but feed costs are still very high and currently look high for some time to come, especially proteins. Wheat has been high, which has been good when selling but it has dropped 20% in the last 3 months. This I think is because the grain corridor from Russia and Ukraine has been successful in moving a lot of grain, but is of course precarious. This grain is being sold guite cheaply and so to be competitive our price has had to drop, as we still have a large surplus from last harvest to export.

In February we will be doing the farmland bird count. This is important to us as it will show whether our wild bird feeders (see picture) and other measures we are taking to create habitats to improve biodiversity to flourish are being successful, so fingers crossed we count more than last year.

Buckinghamshire Council

Well another year 2023, and already we are in February with the days getting longer and spring is in sight.

As per the November edition, Buckinghamshire Council has been working hard on its priorities and spending plans for the year 2023/2024. The Council has proposed a budget increase of 2.99% in the base rate in the council tax. This is set against an increase in inflation. as measured by the Consumer Price Index of over 10%. In addition, it is planning to take up the Government's proposal for a Social Care Precept of 2%, meaning a total rise of 4.99% in bills. These increases are still to be ratified by the end of February by the full Council.

With the rise in the cost of living, Buckinghamshire Council still has the "Helping Hand" initiative which is there to help

individuals or families in need, those on low incomes and those who are experiencing a financial emergency or crisis. See




The Christmas services were well attended this year – particularly the Crib Service and Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Services.

The benefits of rematching are great for both parties. The guest and their family can stay within the area, the children can remain in local schools and the support network, jobs and friendship groups remain intact.

The new host family can make a very real difference by offering a safe place for the guest to stay; communication is hugely improved as English acquisition is greater than when they first arrived, and all the hard work of settling the family into the community, work, schooling, GPs, bank accounts etc... has already been done. Many of our hosts have discovered that genuine companionship, found through sharing their home, is a rich gift.

We have many hosts who would be happy to share their very positive experiences and the Ukraine to Chilterns Charity is always there, along with the Council's liaison officers, to support as necessary. If this is not for you then there are many other ways to help, so that together we can stand tall with Ukraine.

Initially, it was planned to be small and very local, but the residents of Princes Risborough and nearby villages showed such a burning desire to help, that today Ukraine to Chilterns is already a developed official charitable institution. They fund-raise locally and are supported by other reputable charitable institutions. Princes Risborough Rotary Club works closely with this organisation, helping with generous donations for specific needs and organising events. Ukraine to Chilterns took over the organisation of the Christmas celebration - the first Christmas in Britain for all Ukrainians.

The holiday turned out to be really wonderful and everyone got a lot of pleasant emotions. Elim Church kindly offered their



large hall. The event also featured a wonderful band 'Black Dog' performing traditional English dance music.

Surprisingly, not only Ukrainians, but even the British were dressed in festive Ukrainian traditional clothes – Vyshyvanki - shirts and dresses with embroidered patterns. It looked like spring had come in the middle of winter. It really warms the heart - to see a Vyshyvanka even in a foreign country.

Everyone was looking forward to sitting down at the table and eating together. Ukrainian families prepared many traditional treats. While everyone enjoyed and savoured, the group "Black Dog" performed incredible and fun English traditional songs. Under such accompaniment, the children also ran faster, and conversations went more easily, and their eyes sparkled more lively.

Some Ukrainian families have been living in Buckinghamshire for more than half a year, but frankly speaking, every time you meet faces that show tension and confusion. This is the normal state of people whose past is broken in an instant, and the future is unclear and hazy. They have only the present left, and thanks to the sensitivity of the British, Ukrainians are safe and can breathe easy. One should give credit - the efforts of the English were not in vain, after half an hour even those who were completely confused began to smile, melt and talk friendly with people.

Children do not take care of it. Small children are better than everyone else - they exist only in the present, where there are pleasant smiling people around, beautiful, like doll houses, houses, gardens, parks and



many opportunities to play and have fun. Perhaps we should all learn from children how to face a new day full of optimism. Because it is impossible to describe in words the emotions that children felt when the real Santa Claus gave them wonderful gifts. These gifts had been kindly provided with a grant from the North West Chilterns Community Board.

After the Christmas dinner and receiving gifts, there was another unexpected surprise - the group "Black Dog", together with Tony Bundock, taught Ukrainians traditional English dances. There was a lot of laughter and fun, because it was not easy to remember the moves!

At the end, Ukrainians sang Christmas carols in their native language. In those carols, it is told that we all rejoice because Christ was born and we wish everyone well in the new year.

Everyone knows what a wish all Ukrainians made. Probably, millions of people all over the world made this wish on New Year's Eve. But the most important thing is that even now, when the whole world is struggling with an economic and energy crisis, the British found an opportunity to warm the lonely hearts of war victims and fill them with warmth. After all, kindness and love are what people from all over the world can oppose to evil. This is the only thing that saves the world. The British felt that the event was full of emotions and good impressions, and the Ukrainians sincerely thanked for the kindness, for the opportunity to gather together and feel that you are not alone.

Heavenly Bodies

Three fabulous planets dominate our February evening skies to give us quite a performance! Mars, Jupiter and Venus are shining brightly and jump out at you from their starry backdrop.

Venus blazes low in the south-western sky just after sunset and doesn't hang around for long before it disappears below the horizon. So be sure to look out for it early evening in the scenarios described below.

Glorious Venus is the brightest and whitest of the three planets, and some call it the 'evening star' as it emerges from behind the Sun. It's approaching its furthest distance from the Sun as we see it, so the Earth-sized planet appears to climb closer and closer to Jupiter above. During this journey, on February 22nd, Venus, Jupiter and the crescent Moon form a triangle in the sky which will be a beautiful spectacle (see sky chart).

The following evening, the Moon will be above the two planets as it orbits Earth faster than a speeding bullet. It will be

below the 'Seven Sisters' star cluster (aka the Pleiades) in the evening and night of February 26th.

Meanwhile, Venus continues to edge nearer to Jupiter until the two are side by side and closest together on the magical evening of March 1st (see sky chart). It's amazing to think that although Venus will out-shine Jupiter and appear to be about the same size as its neighbour, more than 1,000 Venuses would fit inside Jupiter. Their 'similar size' is of course an illusion because enormous Jupiter will be four

times further away from us than Venus – 860 million kilometres compared to 204 million km.

Mars starts the month high above the Orion constellation in the south-east. The 'Red planet' shines a deep orange colour, which is complemented by the bright orange star Aldebaran just below it (this star is 44 times wider than our Sun!). Mars has its own lunar rendezvous on February 27th when the Moon will be just to the right of it.

From the planets to a comet. There is one affectionately called Comet c/2022 E3 ZTF which may be bright enough to be seen with the naked eye (unpredictable at the time of writing!). The first week of February is the best time to catch it, probably with binoculars, before it fades. The comet will be in the region of the bright star Capella – exact location at https://theskylive.com/
